



# Missing Persons Answer Key



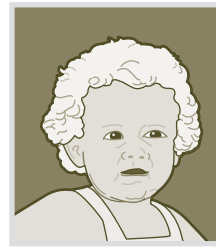
**Amelia EARHART**

**Status:** A two-week search conducted by the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard was unsuccessful. The cause of Earhart's disappearance remains a mystery.



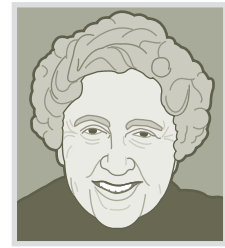
**Jimmy HOFFA**

**Status:** His body was never found and a death certificate was issued seven years after he disappeared.



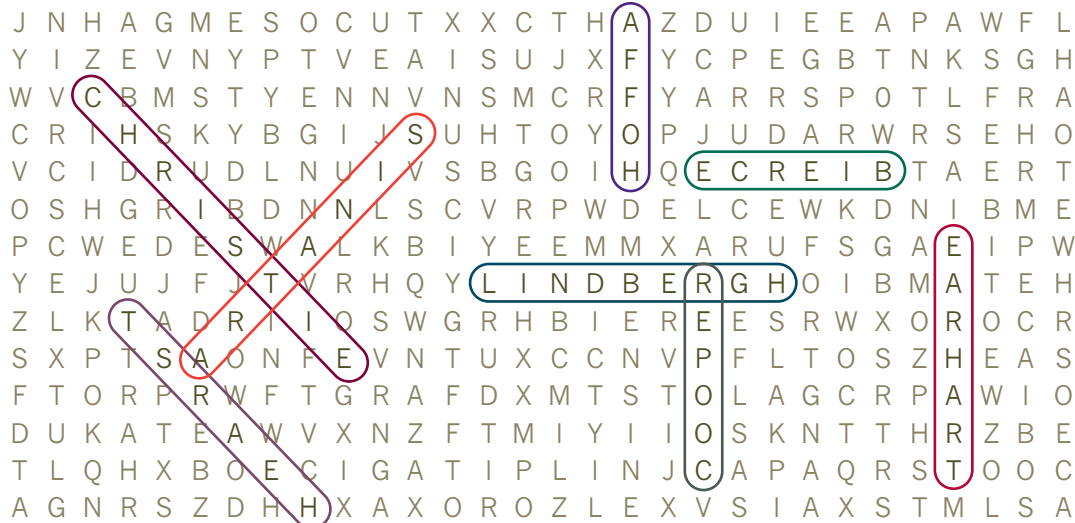
**Charles LINDBERGH, Jr.**

**Status:** The corpse of a toddler was found a few miles from the Lindbergh estate on May 12, 1932. Lindbergh did not allow an autopsy, fueling several conspiracy theories. Bruno Hauptmann, a German carpenter, was convicted and executed for the crime.



**Agatha CHRISTIE**

**Status:** Ten days later, Christie was located staying at a hotel under the name of her husband's mistress. She claimed to have suffered a nervous breakdown due to her husband's infidelity. The incident was dramatized in the Dustin Hoffman film, *Agatha*.



**"D.B. COOPER"**

**Status:** In 1980, a family on a picnic near Vancouver found \$5,800 of Cooper's ransom. Cooper was never apprehended and the case remains history's only unsolved skyjacking.



**Frank SINATRA, Jr.**

**Status:** Returned to Ol' Blue Eyes three days after the kidnapping, the "Chairboy of the Board" went on to become his father's musical director and conductor. The three kidnapers spent less than five years behind bars for the crime.



**Ambrose BIERCE**

**Status:** In his last letter, sent from Chihuahua, Bierce wrote, "If you hear of my being stood up against a Mexican stone wall and shot to rags please know that I think that a pretty good way to depart this life. It beats old age, disease, or falling down the cellar stairs." He was never heard from again.



**Patty HEARST**

**Status:** Hearst was arrested on September 18, 1975 along with other members of the SLA. She spent two years in prison after being convicted of bank robbery. Bill Clinton granted Hearst a full pardon on the final day of his presidency in 2001.
